### Kia ora Aidanfield Whānau

It is the middle of the year (to state the obvious). I am surprised at how fast this year is going as we approach the next school holiday period. Term 2 is only 9 weeks long but so much has happened in this short time. As well as the usual classroom programmes we have:

- Finished a very productive time hosting students from MOIS, a high school in Japan. They come for a week each year and are a delight have in the school.
- Raised a truly spectacular amount to support the work of World Vision. We will reveal the final total later but as I write a phenomenal effort and beyond what we thought possible thank you for your generosity.
- Enjoyed the year 5 and 6 team camp at Woodend and visits to the eco centre this week just gone.
- Run the school cross country earlier in May a great day with such excellent efforts by so many of our young people, which resulted in a strong contingent entered into the Primary Zone cross country event.
- Appreciated the strong performance of our kapa haka who opened the World Christian dance conference in the last holidays.
- Conducted our first round of surveys to help the Board establish the next three year plan.
- Congratulated students who have been selected to be in the special choir and orchestra at the music festival later in the year - and enjoyed a performance from the STRIKE percussion group.
- And so many other great opportunities.

We really are blessed to have a very dedicated group of teachers, support staff and parents who invest deeply into the lives of all of our young people at ACS. I would like to acknowledge them for all they do!

### And another event this week

As I write we are preparing for our Mātariki evening. This year we are cooking a hangi. I would like to honour the work Mrs Joelle Nareki and the families who form part of our regular hui have done. They have been amazing in planning, organising, and putting down the hangi. It is a big undertaking to feed so many. The hole in the ground will be dug on Wednesday, the fire light on Thursday morning and the food covered over to cook around mid-day on Thursday. Our regular Mātariki event will be held in the evening of Thursday, and it will, as always, be an excellent community gathering.

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, celebrations are a great thing to do. They contribute to a community being bonded together, they help to develop relationships, and they are points of reminder throughout the year. In December, Christmas reminds us of the birth of Jesus - God stepping into the world. Easter reminds us of the saving work of Jesus who moved from the cross, through death to resurrection. Mātiriki, while not a part of the Christian calendar invites us to look up, to remember our creator who placed the stars in space, to reflect on our reliance on Him, to see the vastness and wonder of his creation and therefore who He is - and to be called again to worship Him as we walk in the life we are gifted. The invite to you is there, again, this weekend.

And now to segway into other things far less awe inspiring...

### Traffic

I received an email a couple of weeks ago from a concerned parent of the school. She outlined a number of traffic issues outside the school during afternoon pick up times. It is timely to remind everyone of some basic things. I have gone for a blunt approach this time. I do acknowledge that so many of our parent community drive very well around our place - THANK YOU. Unfortunately, there are still a number who just do not get it, and they are dangerous and inconsiderate.

Following staff instructions - THANK YOU! We have seen a significant improvement in the flow of cars around the parking and exiting areas at 3pm. Thank you to all of our parents who have made the choice to pick up their older children a little later. Spreading the traffic through the gate over a 15 minute period after 3pm makes a big difference to the flow. Thank you for following the directions of the staff member on the gate. Their intent is to point you to the exit that is most free flowing at any point in time.

Seat belts! It is a legal requirement to have every person in a moving car in an appropriate restraint. I am dumbfounded at the number of children who leave our school grounds in a car without seat belts on and not in a booster seat if they are young. New Zealand law is very clear. Your child must be seat belted in the car at all times. This is the first thing they should do once they get into your car.

Parking - please - do not park over any of the neighbours driveways or on their grass or where pedestrians walk. It amazes me that some of our people think this is okay. It is illegal and inconsiderate. Do not park over driveway spaces. You must be at least 1 metre away from the driveway.

Nash Road is a road. Therefore, you must give way to all traffic coming from the right when exiting our school driveway onto Nash Road. One of our neighbours further up Nash Road has complained to me about the number of near misses their staff have because people coming out of our gate assume they have right of way - we do not. You must look right every time and give way. Equally, coming into our school drive requires you to give way to traffic coming along Nash Road.

Speed outside school - please keep this down to the maximum of 40km/hr in the morning and afternoon.

The speed limit on school grounds is a **maximum of 10kmh with no exception.** We have young children moving in all sorts of directions and they do not always have good traffic sense.

**Watch your tail!** There is a point in the driveway where, if anyone stops there, we can have cars backed up onto Aidanfield Drive and down to the bridge - just because one person did not think about the back of their car being in the way of everyone else. The cones are there to mark the last space you can park to wait and you must ensure the back end of your car is well out of the way so anyone else can get through.

If grandparents, family members or friends pick up your children please...please, please, make sure they understand all of these aspects - it will help everyone.

I know so many of you do the travel aspect well. Thank you for that! Thank you for being careful, thank you for thinking about the safety of your child and of other people's children. Thank you for following the law with integrity. Thank you for contributing to a safer place for all our young ones simply by being thoughtful.

### **Finally**

To finish on a more positive note, can I encourage you (as I always do at such times) to invest into the lives of your children through the holiday period in any way that you are able to, as you balance the demands of working, parenting, churching, relaxing. Life with children can be complex and demanding and it can be beautiful, rich and rewarding. May you find new ways to enjoy your young people over these coming weeks and marvel in the way they continue to grow and mature.

### Year 5/6 Recycling and Eco Store Trip

On the 16th of July Kowhai 6 went on a trip to the Eco Centre and the Eco Shop. We caught the bus and after a 10-minute ride we arrived at the Eco Centre. We got a brief look at a huge machine that sorts the contents of our yellow bins.

We found out later that it cost \$16.8 million! If ten percent of the load of material from yellow bins is not able to be recycled the whole load goes to the landfill. We learned what items go into each bin and also learnt how the huge sorting machine worked. Something interesting was how magnets picked up steel on a conveyor belt and a special electrical current threw aluminium off the conveyor belt. We learnt what we should do to reduce, reuse and recycle things, and reduce residual disposal (throw out items).

Afterwards we went to the Eco Store and got into groups of two or three. We had an imaginary budget of \$500 to spend as if we were shopping to set up a flat. We arrived back at school just before lunch. Thank you to all the parents that helped us, we couldn't have done it without you.

### Saitama, Japan student visit

Last week we welcomed a group of 14 students from Saitama, Japan. These students were hosted by families connected with Aidanfield Christian School, meaning the experience they had of home life was a genuine, caring one, reflecting great manaakitanga (hospitality). Their visit started with a mihi whakatau - (Māori welcome), before being placed within classes at Year 9-10 for some of their time here. They also had a group of amazing Aidanfield Yr 9-10 students who worked on a project looking at how both Japanese and New Zealand cultures are changing over time.

Food was an integral part of the student connection (an international language for teenagers) and it was beautiful to see how well our tamariki (children) served others. The group also visited Ferrymead Historic Park and The Christchurch Gondola. Horoeka children were treated to a short display of Japanese culture too - origami, dance and music. A session focused on Māori culture was a highlight, as was the chance to go shopping and sightseeing with host families.

A special thanks to our host families, the students who worked on the research project and those who included these young people over the brief time they were here.

Opportunities to be so involved with another culture leave both sides richer for the learning that occurs and the interactions that form friendships. Despite the constant rain last week, our Saitama students left with a warmth of heart and a very positive

outlook on life here.
